

Louisiana Paint Horse Club 2006 Year-End High Point Award Rules

Appropriate awards will be given based on the amount of funds available in the club treasury.

It is each paid member's responsibility to obtain a copy of these rules.

To be eligible for year-end high point class awards, the owner must be a paid member before any points can be earned. Dues are payable on January 1 of each year. LPHC membership year is January 1– December 31. A paid member must participate in each respective class under 50% of the judges at LPHC sponsored show dates/locations:

April 21-22 - West Monroe, Louisiana - 4 Judge POR

July 28–29 - New Iberia, Louisiana - 2 Judges

November 11-12 - West Monroe, Louisiana - 4 Judge POR

Although sponsored by LPHC, points earned at these shows do not count toward year end-high point or the required participation under 50% of the judges::

April 23– West Monroe, Louisiana 2 Judge Cattle-Speed Specialty Show
November 13--West Monroe, Louisiana 2 Judge Cattle-Speed Specialty Show

The July show in New Iberia will be an LPHC Double Club Point show. The Ark-LA-Tex PHC's March & May shows are cross approved for points earned only and do not count toward the required participation in the respective classes under 50% of the judges at the LPHC sponsored show dates identified above.

Weanlings, Longe Line and 2 Year Old Western Pleasure horses need only participate in the November show to be eligible, however points will be earned if they show in prior shows.

To receive a year-end award, you must work 2 hours for the club at the July shows and 1 hour at the Azalea Classic show. You may pay \$25/per hour not worked to defray the cost of show help. There will be a sign-up sheet at each show, or you can contact the show manager in advance to confirm your work hours. Hours worked or paid for must be completed by the July show.

To receive points in Amateur, Novice Amateur, LPHC Youth/Amateur Breeding Stock, and in Youth a one horse, one owner/family member exhibitor combination is required. In Open, points go to the horse. If the exhibitor differs from the owner, points will still count.

The point system used will be counted on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Points will be awarded based on the number of horses entered. The horse shall earn 1 point for each horse placed below it and 1 point for the horse itself. The maximum points for any class shall be 6 and the minimum, 1. Credit will be given for participation in the class, if no points are earned and will be noted with a –0–.

If a horse or horse/exhibitor combination show in the LPHC sponsored shows in April and/or July, but cannot show in the November show because of illness, injury, death or incapacitation, but are still ahead in points at the end of the year, these points will stand. The horse or horse/exhibitor combination will qualify for the high point with proper documentation of illness, injury, death or incapacitation with a Doctor's or Veterinarian's written statement. Also, In the case of a deceased or incapacitated youth or amateur horse and the subsequent purchase of another horse, the points earned with the deceased or incapacitated horse will be combined with those earned on the subsequent horse with proper documentation of the death or incapacitation of the first horse.

Year-end Hi Point Division Awards are listed in the Hi-Point Awards Rules for Shows – 1st paragraph. To be eligible for the LPHC year-end Hi Point Division Awards, the member must qualify per the class rules above and per the Hi-Point Awards Rules for shows e.g. no. of classes in the division.
